- There are two options Upass to have cheap affordable option. The other option is to raise parking costs so the \$280 for transit will look cheap.
- We are in a position where this issue needs to be addressed.
- If the University will administer it, it would be a big win for students.
- If this is an issue that affects students then they should vote on it, we shouldn't be the ones that say "no students can't vote on it."

6.3 **CHINOOK AWARDS** – Hailey

Undergraduate research is a big attraction for students. Students were being paid well below minimum wage while doing research. It's very intense work and competitive for students who receive these awards. We don't want to exploit students work. QIP — we have a large amount of funds the Chinook Award. In order to comply with labor legislation the university wants to increase the money to help provide to students. The ULSU wasn't consulted in this decision at all until faculty got involved. If the money isn't made up then the program won't go forward. We feel this program is non-negotiable and feel we can't compromise on. If donations are made for four years then it will be sustainable. This is a little more dire than it normally would be because we don't know what the government is going to do and everyone is scrambling for money. We have exhausted every avenue that we could think of and have spent countless hours. We thought we would treat this as a capital project. In order for this program to survive would we be willing to use \$9,000 out of capital projects? This will need to come to GA for approval.

Comments and Open discussion

- Has the topic of reducing the number of seats been brought up? Yes it has been but we
 felt that it's not something that we want to see because there's already a limited
 amount.
- Is this decision going to be made without GA approval? We want to get the GA's point of view. QIP is money that the University's has given to us, we aren't losing the money we would just be reallocating it. This is a big request and doesn't come forward very often, EC has spent countless hours on this and have expressed all of your sentiments.
- There are more substantial contributions from the faculties.
- If we cut the awards it will affect humanities and social funding.
- They want us to have an answer within the next couple of days, keeping in mind that the deadline has already been extended for application for this award.
- Suggest that if we give them the one time funding and we are given a guarantee that the program will continue.
- If anyone has grievances it should be with the university. If we give them money it needs to be in writing that it's a one-time thing.
- This program is essential and is well worth allocating the money to the Chinook awards.
- For humanities the grants are really hard to come by and the Chinook wards are very valuable to them.
- Slightly opposed to giving money to such a small group of people instead of using it for capital projects.

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- How much on average is left over in capital projects each year? We are no longer subject to the 2% left over so in the past we have used it all.
- If there was a capital project we can always tap into the ULSU operating budget.
